Introduction

It is appropriate to know the purpose of the first coming of Jesus in order to understand the purpose of his second coming.

Only when the purpose of his first coming is applied in our lives, we will be ready to meet him at his second coming.

The purpose of the first coming of Jesus could be understood from three aspects:

- 1. The message given by an angel to Joseph
- 2. John the baptist's introduction of Jesus
- 3. Jesus' mission statements



2.1

Angel's Message

Matthew 1:1 says:

"She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

I am sure you are familiar with the story of Jesus' birth. An angel had appeared to Joseph in a dream. And the angel told him that Mary would give birth to a son and he was to give him the name 'Jesus'.

The angel also described the meaning of the name 'Jesus'. It means 'He will save his people from their sins'. Even before the birth of Jesus, the purpose of his coming was revealed to Joseph. Jesus was born to save us from our sins.



2.2

John the Baptist's Introduction

John the Baptist introduced Jesus to the public. When he introduced Jesus in John 1: 29, he said:

"Look, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world!"

What is the meaning of "Lamb of God"?

We know that in the Old Testament, a lamb was sacrificed for the atonement of Israel's sin. John introduced Jesus as the lamb provided by God for the atonement of human sins. As a fulfilment of the sacrifice of a lamb in the Old Testament, Jesus was the sacrificial lamb for the remission of sins.

At the crucifixion, Jesus shed his blood for the remission of our sins. Jesus replaced the atonement lamb and died for our sins. We receive forgiveness of our sins from God because of Jesus' death on the cross.

John's introduction is similar to the angel's message. Both the angel and John the Baptist announced the purpose of the first coming of Jesus.



2.3

Jesus' Mission Statements

We read in Mark 10:45 Jesus said that he came to:

"give his life as a ransom for many."

What is the meaning of ransom?

Ransom means redeeming someone from captivity by paying a price. Jesus gave his life as a ransom to redeem us from the power of sin. Jesus used the word ransom here to indicate that his life was the price paid for redeeming humanity. However, we must understand, the ransom was not paid to Satan to release people from Satan.

His life was a sacrifice offered to meet the requirement of justice. God cannot forgive mankind simply because he loves us.

Why not?

Because he is a God of justice and he had to meet the requirement for justice. Therefore, he offered his son to pay the penalty of sin. Thus Jesus gave his life as a ransom to save people from sin.

We read in John 10:10,

"I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full."

In this verse we find Jesus came to give life to people. People are spiritually dead and Jesus came to give life so that everyone can be alive in God and respond to God's love. Further he said that his intention was for everyone to have life to the full. When we have a right relationship to God, we live a life of fullness. Jesus came to give us fullness of life, as God intended for humans.

There are many factors that prevent us from having a life of fullnes. The most important factor is sin that causes disharmony within ourselves, with others and God. Jesus died on the cross to save us from the power of sin. When we receive the forgiveness of sins we are restored to have fullness of life.



Fullness of life does not mean accumulation of wealth and materials. Fullness of life means to have a balanced life. A life in which all aspects would be in harmony with God.

If you are not enjoying the fullness of life, you must come to Jesus. If you are not sure that the purpose of the first coming of Jesus is fulfilled in your life, this is the right time for you to receive the forgiveness of sins by believing that Jesus died for your sins.

Since you are interested in knowing about the second coming of Jesus, you must make sure that the purpose of his first coming is fulfilled in your life before we proceed to the next lesson.
